For Health & Safety of Your Camper

For those campers who will need medication while attending our camp or who have chronic medical conditions, please read this important information!

“Medication” is *any* substance a camper takes to maintain and/or improve their health. This includes vitamins and natural supplements. We REQUIRE all medication to be in the ORIGINAL PHARMACY CONTAINER WITH RX LABEL ATTACHED WHICH SHOWS THE CAMPER’S NAME, DOSAGE, AND WHEN/HOW THE MEDICATION SHOULD BE GIVEN. Please provide enough medication to last the entire time the camper will be at camp!

ANY CAMPER PRESENTING UNLABELED MEDICATION WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO PROCEED UNTIL THE ORIGINAL CONTAINER AND LABEL ARE PROVIDED.

This form must be completed and brought with you on the first day of camp, so we have important information on your camper’s medication needs.

The following non-prescription medications may be stocked in the camp Infirmary and are used on an as-needed basis to manage illness and injury. You would be called prior to your child being given anything in order to get permission if not already given in advance.

Acetaminophen (Tylenol), Ibuprofen (Advil, Motrin), Sudafed, Sudafed PE, Antihistamine/allergy medicine, Robitussin cough syrup, sore throat spray, Lice shampoo/cream, Antibiotic cream, Calamine lotion, Aloe, Pepto-Bismol/Kaopectate.

About Our Camp:

The program takes place in the outdoors. It can be reasonably expected that your camper will be exposed to trees, grasses, dust, pollens, molds, insect bites, and a host of other environmental factors that may be out of our control.

- Please bring a doctor's order if a rescue inhaler must be on the camper's person at all times. Please check here and discuss past asthma triggers with nurse upon arrival. Expect our healthcare provider to place her own initials on the inhaler(s). This marking is a visual cue to our staff that the camper must have this medication with them at all times.
- If your camper must have an emergency epinephrine injectable pen for emergency use, please check here and discuss with nurse upon arrival. The injectable must be in the original RX box with the prescription label clearly showing.
- If your child is diabetic and uses injectable insulin, please check here and discuss with nurse upon arrival. The injectable must be in the original RX box with the prescription label clearly showing.

The pick up and drop off of medication(s) must be made by a responsible parent/guardian of the camper. We require signature indicating both that it was dropped off and again on last day for pick up indicating that the parent/guardian received back the right medication for their camper.
