in-season general membership

This includes volunteers in the league

- More than Board of Directors
- Coaches, umpires, official scorers, groundskeepers, team parents, concession workers, etc.

An individual must have a defined role and responsibility to be a member

Regular Members are those that are eligible to vote at membership meetings

Parents are not members, unless they qualify

Members should not be involved in the operation and promotion of other youth baseball/softball organizations



pre-season planning volunteer appointments

Each manager, coach and umpire must be appointed by League President and approved by the Board of Directors

League President first makes appointments, which are provided to Board of Directors for review

 If League President does not appoint, board will not review





pre-season planning volunteer appointments

No manager, coach or umpire has tenure

 Each must be appointed and approved annually to continue to serve
pard is not required to approve each


Board is not required to approve each appointment

DO NOT provide a reason to a manager, coach or umpire if he/she is not appointed or approved





pre-season planning volunteer appointments



submits

Volunteer Submits Application checks

Background check completed

nominates

President Nominates at Discretion

approves

Board Approves at Discretion, President Appoints



in-season membership discipline

Members are also subject to discipline

Any discipline MUST be applied according to the local league's constitution

A forum must be provided to allow for response to the allegations

Any disciplinary action must take place at duly-organized board meeting

2/3 majority vote is needed to take disciplinary action

Discipline cannot go past the current or fiscal year



in-season membership discipline

Committee receives complaints IN WRITING and reports to the Board.

Board could decide to take no further action or send WRITTEN notice to the accused; when, where and why they need to appear (due process).

Board could decide to draft a written warning, temporarily suspend Membership privileges, or suspend or revoke Membership privileges for the remainder of the year (2/3 majority vote is needed)
